
Broadway is reopening and the hottest ticket in town is *The Music Man* starring Hugh Jackman and Sutton Foster. We have secured tickets!

Fred Plotkin is one of the world's foremost opera experts, noted for the depth and breadth of his knowledge and for the joy and ease with which he shares it. He is the author of Opera 101: A Complete Guide to Learning and Loving Opera, the best-selling standard text in America for opera education. He is the author of six books on Italian food and wine. He has lectured, taught, consulted and held managerial or artistic roles at some of the top opera companies, including La Scala; the Metropolitan Opera; the Royal Opera House, Covent Garden; and the Lyric Opera of Chicago. He led opera and food symposia for New York Times Journeys and, since April 24, 2020, has hosted Fred Plotkin on Fridays, a weekly program of cultured conversations seen worldwide on Idagio.com.

Itinerary

Day 1: Welcome to New York!

Day 2: Madama Butterfly & Music Man!

Morning at leisure, perhaps visit the shops, galleries, old and new landmarks and distinctive neighborhoods in Manhattan and the other boroughs. Fred Plotkin can provide you with suggestions to suit your interests. Walk to Lincoln Center for a matinee performance of Puccini's *Madama Butterfly* at the Metropolitan Opera starring Eleonora Burrato, Elizabeth DeShong, Brian Jagde, with Alexander Soddy conducting the beloved Anthony Minghella staging. Then head to dinner in a classic theater district restaurant before taking your side or rear orchestra seat for Meredith Willson's *The Music Man* at the Winter Garden Theater. (D)







Day 3: Discover the Opera Stars of Tomorrow!

After breakfast on your own, meet Fred Plotkin and your new friends at noon to discuss the previous day's performances and today's special event. Then depart for Lincoln Center and the Metropolitan Opera National Finals Competition, conducted by Marco Armiliato. This is Opera's "American Idol" in which thousands of aspiring opera stars are whittled down to a handful of finalists who compete for five prizes. Many of your favorite stars, including Renée Fleming and Deborah Voigt, saw their careers launched by the Met Finals. Then go to dinner at an elegant nearby restaurant and discuss whether the judges made the right choices! (D)



Day 4: Lucia di Lammermoor: New Production of a Bel Canto Classic

After breakfast on your own, meet with Fred for a late morning lecture and conversation about this evening's opera as well as other cultural topics. Then enjoy lunch with the group at a restaurant near the hotel, followed by the afternoon on your own to shop, visit a museum or relax. In the evening, head to the Met for a 7:30 pm curtain of Simon Stone's new production of Donizetti's *Lucia di Lammermoor* starring Nadine Sierra and Javier Camarena, conducted by Riccardo Frizza. Day 5: Anna Netrebko Takes on Turandot

After breakfast on your own, meet with Fred for a late morning lecture and conversation, followed by a farewell luncheon at one of New York's top restaurants. Enjoy the afternoon on your own before heading to the Met for the 8 pm curtain of Puccini's *Turandot* starring Anna Netrebko, Ermonela Jaho, Yonghoon Lee and the legendary Ferruccio Furlanetto in the historic Franco Zeffirelli production, conducted by Marco Armiliato. Day 6: Farewell Until Next Time

After breakfast on your own, and nourished by music and all kinds of cultural and social stimulation that is part of time spent in New York, return home renewed. (no meals)







Accommodations

Hotel Central Park

New boutique property located close to Central Park. There is plenty of greenery throughout the property and a living green façade greets guests on arrival. The emphasis on greenery and the use of natural materials create a calming retreat from the city bustle outside. All guest rooms include organic bedding, filtered water taps, free wifi and a nespresso coffee machine, hepa air filters, five-minute shower timer and digital newspapers. There is a limited number of rooms with two beds. There are several farm-to-fork dining options in the hotel including in-room dining and a market stand in the lobby with fresh seasonal fruit; imperfect in appearance these fruits would otherwise have been discarded by local grocers but are tasty and available to hotel guests.
